2. CIP Update from SCI

Blair Aas of SCI Consulting Group distributed and discussed with the committee a presentation titled, Fire Impact Fee Program Adoption, Implementation and Annual Administration. Mr. Aas explained that any districts interested in fee collection will have to participate in the program and meet all the requirements. He also stated that he is working on a checklist for the release of funds and that the county wants a collection agreement between the districts indemnifying the county.

Chief Combs discussed the ongoing issues he has encountered concerning the release of CIP development impact fees by the county related to the engine unit his district purchased. Cameron Park and El Dorado Hills have also encountered issues pertaining to the county's inability to release funds.

Sue Hennike, Principal Administrative Analyst, El Dorado County, stated that the Walker court case has had an impact on the release of funds and the pending appeal will help guide what action the county will take.

Mr. Aas advised that he and Ms. Hennike have a meeting with Joe Harn, Auditor-Controller, today, November 3. He stated that he will provide Deputy Chief Keating an update on the outcome of the meeting.

Gratitude was extended to all districts that provided support during the Butte Fire. A burn suspension with Sacramento will go into effect November 9. Transitional period with reduction to one engine will occur in November and minimal staffing will take effect in December. On November 9 the exclusive use helicopters will be moved to McClellan.

<u>Cameron Park Fire</u>: The final inspection on the new vehicle was completed last week and delivery is expected in late November.

<u>Diamond Springs / El Dorado Fire</u>: Renovations on the station are proceeding. The new engine is currently out of service due to minor body damage.
