- IX. Old Business
 - 1. CCFD Update (Roberts) The EDC Board of Supervisors passed the contracts to get them the patch funds. Phase II permanent solution deadline move up and due in one year. The Board of Supervisors formed this group and they report directly to the Board of Supervisor and to their Fire Boards. This structure necessitates each District needing a rep present.
 - 2. Local AOP's for 2014 (USFS) Mac Heller brought the shift tickets and instructions. Those that don't have their AOP's should contact Nickie Washington. If you don't have one, getting paid becomes very difficult.
 - 3. Dispatch CQI Committee (Keating) Chief Keating sent out email clarifying what the intent of the committee is along with a letter from Chief Roberts with concerns about the technology. Chief Schwab indicated they talked about it at Fire Ops and he is working on those take-away items.

Chief Kaslin indicated Captain Mitchell will be the rep for the ECC and Chief Wood can speak on behalf of the ECC. His believes with regards to the technology components a specialist like Frank Yost from the Radio shop is needed to speak to the technical points. Chief Keating acknowledged they are keeping the committee lean to start.

X. New Business

Presentation by LA Firefighters Credit Union

1. Chief Hardy provided introductions. A brief presentation from Darrick Figg and Vince Cardinale of LA Firefighters First Credit Union of services offered and benefits of membership available to firefighters and their immediate family.

XI. Department Reports (as needed)

- CalEMA/OES: Chief Humphries In full swing with fire preparedness. 7 type 1 engines at Mather they are going to place in service. The requests for Type 3 engines continue to come in. Doesn't know cut-off date for accepting those letters. Region 4 is going to get the first 5 of those type 3 engines, anticipated 1st week of July to in service ETA. Amador El Dorado PRC met this month; if you need applications that need reviewed, let them know. The application information is on the CICCS website. Region 3 is still vacant due to retirement. If you have large scale exercises in the ops area please let him know as they now have to send a report quarterly to DHS. AR330 all risk strike team leader as of 2014 is a requirement for new strike team leaders.
- CalFire: Chief Mike Kaslin SRA fee discussion. They are following state laws. Augmentation requests due to the drought. Their evident drought response measures: brown lawns, not washing fire engines as frequently, etc. Direction of the Governor. Dry mopping. Part of the augmentation is requesting additional personnel. Defensible space inspections are moving forward. Chief Kaslin provided a brief summary of recent staffing changes. Burn permits are going to be required starting May 1. Will play burn suspension by ear based on conditions.
- Cameron Park: Chief Sanders Vacant board seat was not filled. November will be political shift at Cameron Park with four of the five board position up for election, coinciding with county Board of Supervisors position changes.
- Diamond Springs/El Dorado: Chief Combs In process of purchasing equipment to outfit the truck they purchase from EDH. Chief Ransdell working on a regional truck academy so let them know if you have people you want to send to that. He expressed thanks to CalFire for the first in fire suppression support during the last 4 structure fires. Investigation trailer received additional funds from the Sheriff's office to help with that and hoping to finish that this spring. Their Volunteer FF association is switching up their fundraising activities this year instead of Labor Day they are doing a car show and will be planning something different for August.
- El Dorado County: Chief Hardy County Fire is still in brown-out: station 74/engine 21. Monitoring the cost savings. Staffing down 7 positions: 5 fire district and 2 JPA funded. They have offered positions to 2 apprentices: Sean Reffner and John Thorne start next Monday. July 1 will staff back up. He expressed thanks to OES for getting them the engine: E372 out at St. 23 and available.
- El Dorado Hills: Chief Roberts Latrobe and Rescue arrangements already discussed.
- Fallen Leaf: Chief Couper -
- Garden Valley: Chief Bement Chief Dekker needs the funds for the team building event (Rivercats baseball game) now from participants. Garden Valley starting talks with Georgetown and Mosquito about shared services. Winter people got picked up USFS and in other positions so it's great they are back to work.
- **Georgetown:** Chief Schwab At Board direction Georgetown is working on reorganization/potential management with Mosquito and Garden Valley.
- Lake Valley: Chief Gareth Harris Safer grant applied for and turned down but keeping their folks on staff. Crew comes on mid-May. Lots of fuels work with expectation of busy fire season. Chief Pang retired now. Signed a contract with NTFPD.
- Latrobe: no report
- Meeks Bay: no report
- Mosquito: no report
- Pioneer: no report

- Rescue: Chief Keating safer grant is ending so going back to 6 fulltime employees. One person out on worker's comp injury so short staffed. EDH/RES will continue shared service agreement and work towards to making permanent with Keating stepping down to Deputy Chief and Roberts to assume Chief of both departments.
- USFS/ENF: Mac Heller bringing on temporary employees May 5. Any departments interested in cross training with their engines or crews should contact them.

XII. Section Reports

- 1. Training Officers no report
- 2. Fire Prevention Officers Chief Combs indicated the fire code adoption is in County Counsel's office so he is working with Tom Burnett to move it along to bring to the County Board of Supervisors in May. When they purchased the truck, they took it out of General Fund revenue and would reimburse the General Fund from the capital improvement funds. Capital improvement funds have not had any accounting since 2011 by the CAO's office; until that is completed they aren't allowing them to spend the money. CIP fee adjustments are being taken on a case by case basis. Mike Applegarth assured him it would go to the Board of Supervisors in May and will take previously submitted CIP back to the board for approval and get them updated at that time.

XIII. Standing Committee Reports

- 1. EMS Agency: no report
- 2. OES, State: covered
- 3. OES, County: no report
- 4. Local Mutual Aid: Chief Schwab working with Mark Di Ambrosia for Region 4 for the XED. He passed out strike team rotations and spoke to the changes with less participating engines and staff reductions. Chief Schwab will be releasing the homeland security grant funded mobile radios to Tahoe within 6 weeks. Finishing up water tender surveys to help out TOs and Fire Ops. There will be a peer review committee meeting on May 5 so if you have anyone signing training/tasks books get them to them. If they send someone to another strike team training location, have them send a Xerox of the roster sign in. ROS updates: Captain Mitchell is going to have to get with each agency to update their list of resources to bring current. If you have technical specialists assigned to USAR teams there is an additional step he wasn't aware of. Chief Humphries noted, if you cross staff, it is at the reimbursement rate of the lead agency.
- 5. Operations/Communications: covered
- 6. Fire Safe Council: Pat Dwyer Yesterday they recognized 3 community members for personal initiate for community clean up days/chippers. Home and Garden show took on a life of its own. FSC staff a booth with USFS; EDC will have personnel their also. It is National Wildfire Community Preparedness day today. Revamped the FSC website with each district having a link under cooperators. CWPPs are on there also. They have been trying to get a council going in Pollock Pines and have a citizen that went to the County Board of Supervisors meeting two weeks ago and plead with them for help with CDAP. Supervisor Veerkamp will be there along with EDCF. Heather Campbell is heading. Supervisor Briggs talked to Campbell and proposed end of June at the fairgrounds doing an evacuation drill for the county. Pat feels it should be planned for next spring as now is untimely. They want it done before Briggs leaves office. Elections for the FSC board are in June so have interested parties contact him. Chief Roberts said El Dorado Hills did an evacuation drill for 200 people and it took 8 months to plan. Chief Keating will draft a letter on behalf of the Association.
- 7. LAFCO: Chiefs discussion regarding the Latrobe annexation followed CCFD update. At last BOS meeting they made a sub-committee for Latrobe. BOS put in 30 day extension request for negotiation period. Sub-Committee is Supervisors Mikalaco and Veerkamp. Held meeting about financing ERAF and/or 17 cent discussion. Concern that this would be precedent setting. BOS has been clear this is not going to set the bar and each case is evaluated separately and must be able to show the agencies are doing everything to conserve resources.
- 8. Red Cross: no report
- 9. CalStar: (Speakers name unknown and not on sign-in sheet) Back in February the NTSB along with the FAA they put out safety directives for all air ambulances nationwide based on the last 10 years of incidents. Upgrades may be needed but mostly compliant already. The mom and pop organizations will have trouble meeting these and it will eliminate the smaller companies.

XIV. Good and Welfare

- Chief Combs Arson Investigation Task Force is ongoing but waning participation so encouraging agencies to send interested parties. Two death investigations recently offering good training opportunity. Next meeting on May 1at EDH station 86 at noon.
- Chief Humphries CFAA important issue being discussed. We have \$22 million dollars 2013 unpaid reimbursements returned to them mostly payment to volunteers. USFS business practice doesn't pay volunteers. They see issue of non-payment and getting a new CFAA done by June 30. They sent them a breach of letter. 40% of responses in California are volunteer agency. Those resources won't be available to the USFS if this isn't resolved. Chief Keating asked how they will know if they should not go. Right now their stance is they don't reimburse volunteers. Diamond Springs developed a limited term contract designed specifically for the purpose of strike teams and Chief Combs will share it.
